### Dear Teachers/Interns:

Thank you so much for your dedication to keeping children safe. We are so excited to have your join us in implementing this curriculum in your classrooms. We strive to make this a valuable program for children and to do so rely heavily on strong community partners. Thank you for being one of those partners!

This year will be very similar to past years where you implement safety lessons ONCE A WEEK in your classroom starting in January 2018. **Lessons will begin the week of JANUARY 7**<sup>th</sup>, **2019.** This letter outlines the rest of the plan for the upcoming year and for implementation.

You will be provided with printed, updated copies of the **2018-2019 attendance sheets** and **calendar**, as well as the **2018-2019 pre-test** and **post-test**. All materials have been made available to you online.

# **FY18 Talking About Touching Plan**

- 1. Please begin teaching one safety lesson a week starting the <u>week of January 7<sup>th</sup>.</u> You may do this lesson on the day and time that works best for your classroom schedule.
- 2. In the resource file there is a **teacher's guide**. It has been updated for 2018-2019. Please refer to this for more activity ideas and important information for each lesson.
- 3. The FIRST and LAST lessons require a pre and post-test be done. **These tests have been updated for 2018-2019**.THE DUE DATES FOR TESTS ARE: <u>January 16<sup>th</sup> and April 26<sup>th</sup>, 2017.</u>

#### a. Pre-Test

- i. Pretest should be done individually or in groups of no more than three children
- ii. Questions should be asked as written; no additional prodding or clarification
  - Note, if a child misunderstands you may clarify a word. For example: if you ask
    what would you do if you were lost in a store and they think you asked what
    would they do if they were lost in a storm that should be clarified.
- iii. Write down exactly what the child says
- iv. Record non-responses (including head shakes, shoulder shrugs, etc) in the boxes provided on the left
- v. You can use the same test page for several children, just record all answers
- vi. Names of children do not need to be on the test forms. Results are calculated as a whole for each classroom, site and the Project Now Head Start group

#### b. Post-Test

i. Should be completed in the exact fashion that the pre-test was administered.

A Note on Tests: Upon completion of the curriculum all tests will be "graded." You will receive the results from your classroom and the results of all Friendly House classrooms combined. The test results will come on an individual form and information about how data was gathered and scored will be included.

# <u>Tests may be turned in via postal mail or via email to HeatherL@childabuseqc.org Email is the preferred method!</u>

- 4. You will take attendance every week on the attendance sheet.
  - This needs to be kept up to date and turned in MONTHLY.
  - Please note on the reverse side of the attendance sheet the staff involved in the lessons should be tracked as well (even if they are only in the room for one lesson the entire time)
  - A child's first name and last initial is enough information-we want to ensure we protect the privacy of the family
